Thank you for your interest in our Floorspace Programme.

Disclaimer:

We would like to make you aware that the floorspace programme is a student initiative and as such neither Wayeb, nor the conference organisers are in any way accountable. Nevertheless we provide you with this programme in order to ensure that all student participants have the opportunity to find housing at competitive prices in Copenhagen, during the course of the 16th European Maya Conference.

Important Notices:

- 1) It is also important to note that your participation in the floorspace programme is contingent on having registered and paid a ticket to participate in workshops and/or the conference.
- 2) If you have not yet registered now is a good time to do so. Online registration does not open until in September 2011, but in the interim you may explore the facilities listed under Option 1.
- 3) Furthermore, if for whatever reason you cannot attend the meetings after you have registered, please ensure that you notify the floorspace coordinator immediately since another student will be able benefit from the space.

We can offer you one of the following housing arrangements:

Option 1: Stay in a Hostel/Hotel –see the list of most relevant places below;

Option 2: Stay with one of the students from the Department of American Indian Languages and Cultures. In which case, I will put you in contact with one of our students.

For Option 2 you are required to bring a sleeping bag and towels, unless the specifics of the arrangements differ. But plan on bringing your own sleeping bag and towels nonetheless for added comfort.

Note that the prices provided here are approximations from December 2010 and we cannot guarantee that the same prices will be in effect in December 2011. To be safe count in a circa 10% increase in prices to be sure. Note also that all prices are per person per night!

Option 1: Hostel

(Hostels in Copenhagen are sparse, and Danhostel is probably the only relevant Hostel, due to both price and location)

Danhostel: with a location both close to the city centre, but also to the KUA campus of the University, where EMC will be held. This hostel is nice, modern and comfy with more than a 1000 beds, so it should be possible to find an available bed. The lowest price in a mixed dorm is about 22 Euro a night. http://danhostel.dk/content/us/hostel_details?HostelId=144&RegionAbb=K

Another option is hotels near to the University (KUA) (All are situated between 0.5 km and 3.0 km from the KUA campus. All are also close to city centre). Single rooms are often expensive, so here are some suggestions if you are travelling together as a group of people:

- Hotel Copenhagen: 500m to KUA: if 4 people: w/shared bathroom = approx. 28€/person : w/private bathroom = approx. 46€/person
- Cabinn City: 2km to KUA: standard 3 bed = 38€/person : standard twin bed = 48€/person : standard single = 78€/person
- Absalon Annex: 3km to KUA: basic 3 bed w/shared bathroom = 36€/person : basic 2 bed w/shared bathroom = 39€/person
- Hotel Selandia: 3km to KUA: 3 bed w/shared bathroom = 37€: private double = 49-57€/person
- Hotel Ansgar: 3km to KUA: 4 bed = 34-40€/person : 3 bed = 50€/person
- and finally if you feel like making your stay really different: Hotel Fox, a funky hotel in the centre of Copenhagen, about 60€/person per night in a double room. Check it out: http://www.hotelfox.dk/

Option 2: Student Accommodation

When staying with one of the students accommodations that can offered to you depend on the amount of space that this particular student has it his/her disposal. Some only have space for one, some might have space for more. It will probably be on a sofa or a mattress in the same room as the student, but in rustic instances be prepared to sleep on the floor, hence the name of this programme. So bring your padded mattress along with your sleeping bag. But if you are up for that, we are sure you will have a great time, seeing Copenhagen from a different angle. And let us know if you prefer staying with male or female students! Also please indicate your primary language and country of origin so that we can best pair you off with potential hosts (we all have differing backgrounds and interests).
