

13th European Maya Conference Maya Daily Lives



December 1-6, 2008 Paris, France

The 13th European Maya Conference 2008 will be organised by GERM (*Groupe d'enseignement et de recherche maya*) as a joint cooperation of the *Musée du Quai Branly*, the *Université de Paris I Panthéon-Sorbonne*, the *INHA*, *Institut National d'Histoire de l'Art* and the *CNRS*, *Centre Nacional de la Recherche Scientifique*, in Paris, France, from December 1-6, 2008. The conference will combine a three-and-a-half day long Maya Hieroglyphic Workshop (December 1 – 4) and a symposium (December, 5 - 6).

SYMPOSIUM

The theme of this year's conference will be: "Maya Daily Lives".

Daily life is a basic and inescapable topic for ethnography, ethnohistory and ethnolinguistics, as well as epigraphy, iconography and archaeology, allowing for a genuinely interdisciplinary discussion. It concerns commoners as well as elites, and it refers to the domestic field as much as to the public sphere, and to the social domain as much as to the economical and political one. Daily life has mainly to do with recurrent practices and discourses.

We suggest focusing on:

- material culture (domestic spaces, craft and artistic production, means of subsistence),
- regular activities including rituals,
- learning and modes of transmission of knowledge,
- social relationships between individuals and/or groups, living or dead.

Keynote speakers will include: Andres Ciudad Ruiz (Universidad Complutense de Madrid), Nikolai Grube (Universität Bonn), Julie Patrois (CNRS, Paris), Mario Ruz Sosa (Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México), David Stuart (University of Texas at Austin), Stephen Houston (Brown University) and Valentina Vapnarsky (CNRS, Paris).

CALL FOR PAPERS

The Wayeb Conference Board invites the submission of abstracts concerning the conference topic. Papers will be selected from all subdisciplines of Maya Studies to cover the topic in all dimensions and from various perspectives. Presentations will be accepted in English and Spanish. Abstracts may not exceed 250 words. Contributions of authors who submit more than one abstract (including co-authored papers) will not be considered. Co-authorship needs to be indicated upon submission.

- 2. Adress, Phone Number and email address
- 3. Title of Paper
- 4. Abstract

The abstracts will be forwarded without the author's particulars to an anonymous Review Committee that will be selected by the Wayeb Conference Board.

Deadline for receipt of abstracts is **May 31st**, **2008**.

MAYA HIEROGLYPHIC WORKSHOP
